	Councillor Wright provided the following update:	
	<ul> <li>The Horticultural Committee had a new Community, Yvonne Cunningham;</li> <li>A local resident has expressed interest in having additional fruit trees planted on the wide grass verge between Whitwell Acres and Langton Lea. The resident has also expressed a willingness to personally support the funding for this;</li> <li>Parish Gardener Update – Progress with the general winter maintenance had been reported;</li> <li>The 'Shincliffe Parish Paths/Walks' leaflet dispensers need to be replenished. It was noted that a further batch of leaflets would need to be printed in the not too distant future; and</li> <li>An update on the Sherburn House Planting Initiative was</li> </ul>	

	implementation in March/April 2020 was shared. This was primarily the planting of wild flower beds and daffodil drifts at the North West and North East village entrance junctions.	
11.	Christmas Tree Project (Standing Item)	
	Councillor Wright reported that;	
	<ul> <li>The 2019 Christmas tree project had cost approximately £950. It was anticipated that annual costs for future Christmas Tree Projects would be lower as the stands and lighting purchased were reusable;</li> <li>Councillor Wright had written a letter of thanks to East Grange farm for their support with this project;</li> <li>Future considerations;</li> <li>Promotion of Christmas tree related events</li> </ul>	
	<ul> <li>Possible alternative locations for the High Shincliffe tree</li> </ul>	
	<ul> <li>Consideration of safe access for children when choosing the location for the trees</li> <li>Horticultural Committee to review the Christmas tree project; (1) Managing the size of the trees versus ability to handle the trees. Further discussions will be taken later in the year; (2) The Christmas Tree Project sparked community engagement (Carols, Knitted snowman, school involvement etc.) which should be built on in future years.</li> </ul>	
	<ul> <li>The SPC would again like to record our thanks and gratitude for all of Councillor Wright's efforts in making a success of this project.</li> </ul>	
12.	Shincliffe Play Park (Standing Item)	
	Councillor Ferries provided the following update;	
	<ul> <li>Good progress had been made at the park site despite the wet conditions;</li> <li>Some of the play equipment was now in place. All of the</li> </ul>	
	<ul> <li>equipment should be installed within the next 7-10days;</li> <li>The supply of goal posts for the football pitch in the park was still being pursued;</li> </ul>	

	<ul> <li>Councillor Stoker has agreed to use his Neighbourhood Budget to cover the costs of the mixed hedging on the boundary around the play park;</li> <li>Current expectations were that the play park would remain closed until the end of May; and</li> <li>The proposed community garden event to plant the hedging in the play park would be delayed until later in the year.</li> </ul>
